What a sweet and thoughtful gesture! I simply have no heart to turn it down even though I am not used to being on the receiving end.

There are a few other times Suan sent me her homemade jam and home baked Focaccia bread.

However, I am not the only recipient of her kindness.

She has been bringing food to other Seniors who live alone or when she hears that they are unwell.

Yes, Suan may not be actively involved in the Church but I know she is involved in other humanitarian work.

Within her Dairy Farm Estate where she lives, together with an Austrian neighbour, they have raised funds for Christmas lunch 2020 for all service staff.

Also, since January 2020 Suan has assisted in fund collection to support Malaysian cleaners defray their grocery bills.

Suan is also active in Makan Together Group-Buy in the estate where they collect food orders from the residents and patronise low-business hawkers during the pandemic and then have food delivered to residents at a fee. This delivery fee goes towards the estate's cleaners – Migrant Beverage Fund – called Kindness in a Cup.



Recently, Suan also helped Willing Hearts to collect donation of used items from her residents and also from St Mary's Seniors and had them delivered to Willing Hearts in Chai Chee Community Centre.

I recalled she even housed a female stranger she encountered.

Before Covid-19 days, she would drive our older Seniors who are in the Pastoral Care Ministry to bring Holy Communion to the homebound elderly.

She is certainly blessed with a giving and caring spirit.

She attributes this service to the less fortunate to her father who used to remind the family that "charity begins at home, but it doesn't end there."
