Visit to Novena Church and the Redemptorist Heritage Centre by Audrey Yip

Excitement filled the air as seventeen Seniors from St Mary of the Angels waited in anticipation for a tour of Novena Church and the Redemptorist Heritage Centre (RHC) on 14 July 2022.

Novena Church had undergone extensive renovation and conservation and was re-opened in 2017. The RHC was launched on 9 November 2021, coinciding with the foundation Day of the Redemptorists. Within the walls of the two galleries, artefacts showcased tell the story of the Redemptorists from 1935 to the present. Several principal artefacts and documents from the archives are highlighted, one of which is a Zucchetto owned by Pope John XXIII, who convened the Second Vatican Council.
